Argenta Turtles "Take a Hit" in 2014 - Action Planned to Help Them

As far as breeding was concerned, 2014 was not a good year for the population of Western Painted Turtles near Argenta at the north end of Kootenay Lake. Within hours of the eggs being laid, more than nine out of every ten turtle nests had been raided by predators. Actions are being taken in 2015 to try and turn this high nest failure rate around. <u>Read more</u>

2015-2016 Project Announcement Coming Soon

The approved projects for the coming year will be announced soon, and thanks to all who took the time and effort to apply for FWCP funding!

FWCP-Columbia delivers its projects in three ways: through directed projects (the Board identifies priority work to be done and issues Requests For Proposals); through a Long-term Agreement with the Province of B.C. to implement many of the core projects; and finally though a call for applications from stewardship groups, First Nations, consultants and stakeholders. The fall 2014 call for applications (to deliver projects in 2015) yielded a total of 71 applications for a total "ask" of more than \$2 million.



When Rubbing Noses is a "No-No"

A project in the East Kootenay, partly funded by the FWCP, aims to drastically reduce the potential of physical contact between domestic and wild sheep during critical times of the year. If they do mix, Bighorn Sheep face the risk of catastrophic die-offs or long-term effects from respiratory disease that all domestic sheep carry. <u>Read more</u>
