FWCP-Columbia 2015-16 Projects Announced

The FWCP-Columbia Region Board approved more than \$5.6 million in local fish and wildlife projects in 2015-16. In total, 53 projects will be delivered across the region including 11 projects in the Upper Kootenay River watershed as part of the Upper Kootenay Ecosystem Enhancement Plan (UKEEP), which is funded by Columbia Basin Trust and delivered by the FWCP. <u>Read more</u> and see the full list of projects in the <u>2015-2016 Project Summary</u>.



Funding Conservation Projects Across B.C.

Across it three regions - Coastal, Columbia and Peace - the FWCP will support 124 fish and wildlife conservation projects this year for a total investment of approximately \$8.9 million in 2015-16. See <u>Investment Map</u>.

FWCP-Columbia Quick Facts

- FWCP funding (from BC Hydro) for fish and wildlife in the Columbia Basin has been in place since 1995 and is indexed for inflation each year.
- This year FWCP-Columbia will be investing approximately \$5.6 million on fish and wildlife projects in the region.
- In 2013, the FWCP entered into a long-term agreement with the Province of B.C. to deliver specific fish and wildlife projects across the Columbia Region. These projects are delivered with support from local biologists and include the Nutrient Restoration Program and operation of Hill Creek and Meadow Creek Spawning Channels.
