## Grant Deadline Ahead

Remember to submit your online grant application by 5:00 p.m., Friday, October 28, 2016. We offer seed grants to help get project ideas started, small grants for projects under \$20,000, and large grants for projects valued at more than \$20,000. Projects must align with our Columbia Action Plans (see our <u>Grant Application Information Kit</u>).

Our Columbia Region Board has also identified three regional priorities: stream habitat restoration and enhancement; riparian and wetland restoration and conservation; and fish and wildlife work in the North Columbia.

Don't forget we've made it easy for you to copy from your last grant application. Ask us to copy in the "Notes/ Questions" tab once you have started an application, and refer to the "Help" tab.



## White Nose Syndrome Action Plan

Bat experts from across B.C. recently came together in Chase to draft an Action Plan in Response to the Threat of White Nose Syndrome.
