Used equipment and field gear auction Saturday, June 8

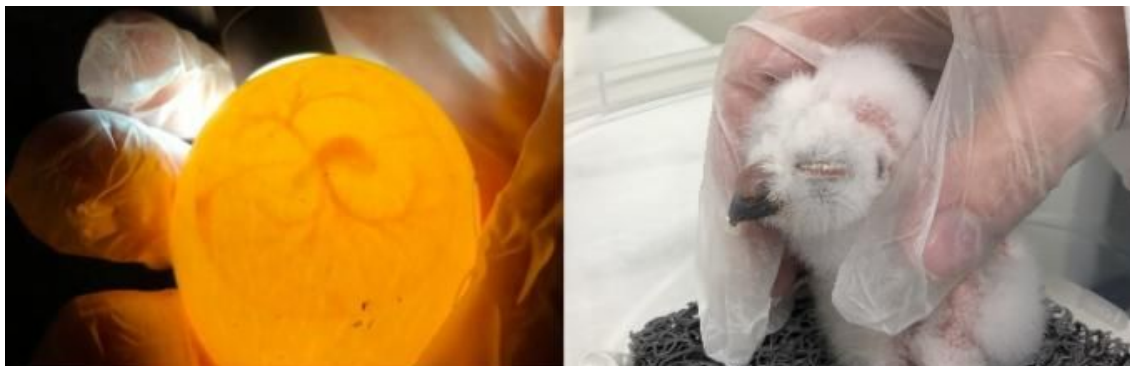
